This plan will serve as a comprehensive guide for implementing flood resilience strategies. It involves conducting a review of existing plans and data, performing a GIS desktop analysis to identify vulnerable areas and critical assets in the County, engage with the public to seek input and identify resilience projects for subsequent implementation.

# Scope of Work Supporting Information - Capacity Building and Planning

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## ***Scope of Work Supporting Information***

**Describe identified resource needs including financial, human, technical assistance, and training needs**

### **Resource need identification\*:**

York County faces significant resource constraints for flooding and stormwater planning and project implementation due to limited local staff time and limited to no funding for project planning, design, and implementation of flood and stormwater mitigation projects. Technical assistance is required for resilience-related planning, from existing conditions collection, needs identification, GIS analysis, design with engineering-level expertise, and project prioritization. Human resource needs include dedicated staff time for project management, grant administration, and ongoing maintenance of implemented projects. Training needs include enhanced capabilities in flood mapping, project prioritization methodologies, and BMP project maintenance management for localities.

In May of 2022, York County completed a review of the Virginia Coastal resilience Master Plan and developed the York County Resiliency Framework as a first step towards developing County's Resilience Plan. Consultant services will be utilized to advance this effort and develop a resilience plan.

**Describe the plan for developing, increasing, or strengthening knowledge, skills and abilities of existing or new staff. This may include training of existing staff, hiring personnel, contracting consultants or advisors**

### **Development of Existing or New Staff\*:**

The County will work with a consultant to develop the resilience plan. The development of this plan provides an opportunity for additional skill and knowledge development for County staff while working with external expertise. The County is part of the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission (HRPDC) and will leverage the collective knowledge from the resilience planning efforts of neighboring localities and regional entities through active coordination during the course of the Plan development.

The development of the resilience plan will establish a set of standard operating procedures and documentation to retain institutional knowledge to better identify local flooding and stormwater needs, identify and development future projects, and identify the best grant funding programs to implement projects. The County will explore available training and certifications from DEQ and DCR to plan training schedule for County staff.

## **Resource Development**

### **Strategies\*:**

The County Resilience Plan process and project list will position the County for competitive grant applications to multiple funding sources, including FEMA hazard mitigation grants, CFPF implementation grants, and Chesapeake Bay restoration funding. The County will continue to staff and coordinate regularly through the Regional Environmental Committee meetings at HRPDC to collaborate with Hampton Roads Phase I and II MS4 localities, providing an opportunity for County staff to convene and learn best practices from neighboring localities.

### **Describe policy management and/or development plans**

#### **Policy management and/or development\*:**

The County will schedule regular Ordinance review and updates resulting from the development of the resilience plan in addition to the regular review and update of the resilience plan itself and integration with the regional Hazard Mitigation Plan update cycle.

The plan will also allow the County to establish the connection between flood resilience and other aspects of municipal planning, such as economic development and resilience, housing, transportation, and overall community quality of life, and incorporate flood resilience needs, strategies, and goals into overlapping projects.

### **Describe plans for stakeholder identification, outreach, and education strategies**

#### **Stakeholder identification, outreach, and education strategies\*:**

Stakeholder engagement will be at the forefront of the conversation as resilience plan development begins. Public outreach will be conducted during the Public Input Period where stakeholders will have the opportunity to provide feedback early in the resilience plan development process. After the Draft Plan is submitted, there will be a Public Posting Period for additional public input ensuring meaningful public engagement throughout the plan development. The Resilience Plan emphasizes that all parts of the locality, regardless of socioeconomic status or race, are considered, and that flood resilience needs of underserved populations are addressed. This inclusive approach to stakeholder engagement is a key part of effective outreach and education.
